3.75mm (F) hook Worsted Weight (4) yarn Safety eyes (9mm) Fiberfill stuffing Wire (optional)

magic ring slst: slip stitch sc: single crochet inc: single crochet increase dec: single crochet decrease BLO: Back loops only FLO: Front loops only hdc: half double crochet



The head features a lot of color changing. Begin with red orange


- r1 6sc in magic ring (6)
- r2 *inc* (12) The next row begins color changes. **Instructions in {blue} are to be worked in bright yellow.**
- **r3** 1sc, inc, 1sc, inc, 1sc, {inc}, (1sc, inc)x3 (18)
- r4 2sc, inc, 2sc, inc, 1sc, {1sc, inc}, (2sc, inc)x3 (24)
- **r5** 3sc, inc, 1sc, {2sc}, inc, {3sc, inc}, (3sc, inc)x3 (30)
- **r6** 4sc, inc, 1sc, {3sc, inc}, inc, {4sc, inc}, (4sc, inc)x3 (36)
- **r7** 7sc, {4sc}, 1sc, {6sc}, 18sc (36)
- **r8** 7sc, {11sc}, 18sc (36)
- **r9** 7sc, {12sc}, 17sc (36)
- **r10** 7sc, {12sc}, 17sc (36)
- **r11** 5sc, inc, 1sc, {4sc, inc, 5sc, inc, 2sc}, 3sc, inc, 5sc, inc, 5sc, inc (42)
- **r12** 8sc, {15sc}, 19sc (42)
- **r13** 9sc, {14sc}, 19sc (42)
- r14 5sc, dec, 3sc, {2sc, dec, 5sc, dec, 1sc}, 3sc, dec, 4sc, dec, 4sc, dec (36)
- r15 4sc, dec, 4sc, {dec, 4sc, dec, 1sc}, 3sc, dec, 4sc, dec, 4sc, dec (30)
- r16 (1sc, dec)x3, 1sc, {dec, 1sc, dec, 1sc}, dec, (1sc, dec)x4 (20)



Place eyes between r10 and r11, about 9 stitches apart.

Horns

- r1 5sc in magic ring (5)
- r2 sc around (5)
- r3 2hdc in next sc, inc around, 2hdc in last sc (10)
- r4 hdc in next sc, sc around, hdc in last sc (10)
- **r5** *1sc, inc* *(15)*
- r6 hdc in next sc, sc around, hdc in last sc (15)



Body

Make with red orange

- r1 6sc in magic ring (6)
- **r2** *inc* (12)
- **r3** *1sc, inc* (18)
- **r4** *2sc,inc* (24)
- **r5** *3sc, inc* (30)
- **r6-7** sc around (30)
- **r8** *3sc, dec* (24)
- **r9-11** sc around (24)
- **r12** *2sc, dec* (18)
- **r13** sc around (18)

<u>Tail</u>

Make with red orange

- **r1** 4sc in magic ring (4)
- **r2** inc, 3sc (5)
- **r3** inc, 4sc *(6)*
- r4 *inc* (12)
- **r5-6** sc around (12)
- **r7** *1, dec* (8)
- **r8** *2, dec* (6)
- r9-21 sc around (6)

<u>Arms/Legs x4</u>

Make with red oranger1 6sc in magic ring (6)r2-6 sc around (6)

Assembly

Sew the body to the head.

Sew the horns on top of the head.









I used wire to make his limbs and tail posable

For his hair-flames, I used an interesting technique I found here: http://sols-crew.tumblr.com/post/43975156663/tutorial-making-a-brushed-yarn-wig

Rather than wefts, just attach yarn with the latch hook method, around his horns and tail end. (I attached 2 plies at a time.) Then split the yarn into individual plies, comb it out a little, and take a hair straightener or iron to it.

She explains it in a lot more detail, so check it out!
